When planning a trip, have you ever wished you had an inside track to the best places to stay, eat, and drink? Or, what attractions are "don't miss," or "experience it if you have time?" Or, the hidden gems that only the locals know about? Here's an insider's guide to the Lewis Clark Valley. **YOUR HOME AWAY FROM HOME** If you're into having all the amenities, the top three choices are the Clearwater River Casino & Lodge, Hells Canyon Grand Hotel, or Holiday Inn Clarkston. Each has on-site dining for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Each also has a pool and hot tub for playing or relaxing.

The Clearwater River Casino & Lodge is the ultimate play-and-stay getaway. They also own one of the best golf courses in town, Red Wolf Golf Club, with scenic views of the Snake River so you can golf, relax, and also enjoy the best in casino gaming. *Local tip: Ask about their Play, Stay, Play Again packages.* 

The Hells Canyon Grand Hotel is centrally located and features an in-house brewery and restaurant with must-try local specialties like Meriwether's Cougar Gold Mac 'n Cheese (you'll never go back to regular mac 'n cheese again!) *Local tip: Don't miss their* summer time Blues & Brews concert series on the patio.

The Holiday Inn Clarkston has front row seats to the best river views whether it's from your room, while dining, or grabbing a drink at the bar. *Local tip: There's a driving range behind the hotel where you can perfect your swing, try out a new golf club, or take a golf lesson.* 

**ECLECTIC EATS** Dining in the Lewis Clark Valley is always casual but for the foodies there are a few restaurants that top the list.

Brava's and Brock's in Town Square features a diverse menu including steak, pasta, and burgers utilizing locally sourced ingredients and prepared fresh. They serve local wine and beer and mouth watering handcrafted cocktails. *Local tip: Try the Bite Size and specialty house salad with poppy seed dressing.* 

Sauté on Sixth is a hidden gem in the Lewis Clark Valley. From their unique downstairs bar featuring original, handcrafted cocktails all the way through to their housemade desserts, dining at Sauté is a decision you won't regret. *Local tip: Always order the special. Try the Smoke and Fire cocktail. Always order the Shrimp Crostini.* 

You'll find quality, fresh eats at any Happy Day Restaurant whether it's their fast food at Taco Time and Arby's, burgers and authentic Tex Mex at Zany Graze, Italian at Tomato Bros, pizza at Southway Pizzeria, or coffee and breakfast to lunch, and dinner at Mystic Café. Local wines and beers are on tap at all but their fast food restaurants. *Local tip: Try the Tex Mex from Zany's authentic Mexican chef, Gorgonzola steak at Tomato Bros, fish tacos for lunch at Mystic, or the Idaho-inspired Loaded Potato Pizza at Southway.* 

**LOCAL FLAVOR ICONS** Effie Burgers is world-famous for their 8-inch, 1 lb burger. They've been making delicious, Instagram-able burgers since 1967.

Fazzari's Finest makes iconic pizzas. They've been a local favorite since 1985. Buzz Feed named them, "One of 18 Pizza Joints You Must Try Before You Die." Local tip: Order the Shotsy, a must-try...mustard sauce, sauerkraut, smoked polish sausage, onions, and a mixture of Swiss and mozzarella cheese. Its tangy flavor will have you planning a repeat trip to Clarkston before the end of your meal. EXPERIENCE

Handcrafted cocktails and bite size steak are the specialty at Hogan's full bar and restaurant Bite size is a local thing...hand cut and marinated steak, grilled to perfection for drool worthy bites of steak. *Local tip: Come early on the weekends. The seats fill up fast and there's usually always live music.* 

Pastry lovers....pay a visit to Skalicky's Sweet Sensations. From scones and cinnamon rolls to breads, rolls, pies, and cakes. This place is the best for regular and gluten-free goodies AND Keto too!

**PLAYING IN HELLS CANYON** Arguably, Hells Canyon National Recreation Area is THE place to visit and the Lewis Clark Valley is the gateway to Hells Canyon, North America's deepest river gorge. Yes, you read that right...deeper than the Grand Canyon. It may not be quite as famous but it is grand. Hells Canyon is home to unique basalt rock formations, white sand beaches, a plethora of wildlife, and a history that's prehistoric.

You can drive to overlooks but the roads are gravel, narrow, and winding. The best way to experience the grandeur of Hells Canyon is by a guided jet boat or rafting tour. Your local guide knows all the best parts about the canyon. You'll hear historical tidbits, see ancient messages carved on rocks (known as petroglyphs) and painted on rocks (known as pictographs, visit a historical ranch, and catch glimpses of wildlife.

If you're looking for a truly immersive experience, book a multi-day rafting trip. You'll see the canyon from a unique perspective. With no ambient light for miles, the stargazing is phenomenal. A hike to Suicide



Point offers sweeping panoramas of the canyon and the winding Snake River.

**MIXING HISTORY WITH ADVENTURE** Nez Perce Tourism provides the cultural tourism experience of a lifetime. Join Nimiipuu guides on a jet boat trip where legends are told and ancient villages come alive through their stories. Experience the connection with the sacred Appaloosa horse during a riding session. Spend time in the Nimiipuu homeland, interact with local tribal people, and see life from a new perspective.

**WINE COUNTRY** The Lewis Clark Valley is a hidden gem of a wine region. If wine tasting is your jam, this is the place. Tasting rooms are uncrowded. The quality of the wine is off the charts. And, the wine is reasonably priced. The Lewis Clark Valley is home to the 2020 Pacific Northwest Winery of the Year and 3 recipients of Idaho Winery of the Year Award, and Sip Magazine's 2021 Winery to Watch, as well as 2 wineries that made the Seattle Times' 20 Best Northwest Wines of 2022.

**RETAIL THERAPY** No vacation is complete without some retail therapy. Take home some memories and flavors of the Lewis Clark Valley. Idaho Memories & Souvenirs in Newberry Square has the best selection and variety of items to take home as gifts or just to remember your trip by. Nez Perce Traditions, also in Newberry Square, has unique handcrafted items made by local and native artisans. From beadwork, to bags and wallets, self-care items to artwork. Local artwork makes a great souvenir and Valley Art Center features art from many local artists as well.

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## YEAR-ROUND RECREATION ABOUNDS

Solace-seekers and extreme adventurers find plenty of river and always one more bend to explore. Between the Clearwater and Snake rivers, water enthusiasts have miles and miles of recreation to choose from. Boat launches give easy access to fishermen, wake boarders, and waterskiers. Grab some supplies for a picnic and set up on one of the many sandy beaches for the day. Or search out a quiet lagoon to relax and enjoy the river, launch a paddleboard, or throw a line. Whether you're a road bicyclist, mountain biker or casual rider, the Lewis Clark Valley has a trail for you. Mountain biking enthusiasts can enjoy miles of dirt trails in Hells Gate State Park and the attached recreational area. With views of the Snake River and nearby Craig Mountains, it's a scenic and peaceful place to escape people and traffic.

Explore and access the incredible views along the way to more than 25 miles of paved pathways on the Clearwater Snake National Recreation Trail system. Here you'll find locals and visitors accessing the trails year round all the way from Asotin to Hells Gate State Park in Lewiston.


#### **CLEARWATER SNAKE NATIONAL RECREATION**

**TRAIL** Utilize more than 25 miles of paved pathways on the Snake and Clearwater Rivers. Parks, beaches, boat launches, and rest room facilities can be found along the route. Access downtown Lewiston via the Clearwater and Snake River Recreation Trail at the 5th Street pedestrian overpass. You'll find unique bike racks that double as art throughout the downtown corridor. There are 12 exercise stations along a 1.25 mile paved trail on the Lewiston Levee Bypass.

HELLS GATE STATE PARK Mountain biking, hiking and horseback riding enthusiasts can enjoy miles of dirt trails in the attached Hells Gate Habitat Management Unit Trail System's recreational area. The park offers hook-up sites, showers, picnic facilities, disc golf, swimming beach, camping and boat moorage. The Lewis and Clark Discovery Center features indoor educational displays, a two-acre outdoor interpretive plaza along the banks of the Snake River, and a beautiful moving stream with sculptures by artist Rip Caswell. ## **PUBLIC GOLF COURSES**

The Lewis Clark Valley earned the name "Banana Belt" due to the mild winter climate. While most of the Inland Northwest is covered in snow and frost, golf courses in the valley are open for business. You can play golf every month of the year on one of the four 18-hole courses in the valley. All courses offer full amenities and are challenging courses to play.

#### **RED WOLF GOLF CLUB**

This beautiful riverside 18-hole course plays longer than the listed yardage (5,400-6,700 yards), presents classic tree-lined fairways, 4 ponds on 8 holes and numerous bunkers and are the fastest greens in the region. ## **AN ANGLER'S PARADISE**

Few places offer the variety and accessibility of outdoor diversions that are found right in our backyard. You don't even have to leave town to find some of the best fishing spots for trolling, spinning, bait casting and fly-fishing. Five public boat ramps and two marinas are located within a few miles.

The spring and summer month's fast action catch is bass, trout and spring chinook. During the fall it is steelhead. The canyon has a healthy number of North America's largest fresh water fish, the great white sturgeon, which can reach lengths of up to eight feet. You can't take one home, but catching one will be the highlight of your trip.

## 31.5 MILES DESIGNATED "WILD"

## EXPLORE HELLS CANYON, NORTH AMERICA'S DEEPEST RIVER GORGE, and the Snake River that winds through

and the Snake River that winds through the canyon. Hells Canyon offers scenic vistas that rival any on the continent, world-class whitewater boating, and spectacular mountain peaks. The vast reaches of remote wilderness are the perfect setting for hiking or horseback riding full of diverse and abundant wildlife, artifacts from prehistoric tribes, and rustic remains of early miners and settlers. Hells Canyon National Recreation Area (HCNRA) truly offers something for everyone, and much to remember.

Guided jet boat and rafting tours leave from the Lewis Clark Valley seasonally. Hells Canyon, though a nationally famous run, has fairly easy whitewater. We highly recommend making reservations in advance with one of our professional guides found on page 22.

Spring rains and snow-melt bring the canyon's sparse vegetation to life from mid-April to mid-June. The middle of the summer, you can expect to have very hot, very dry weather and terrific swimming. Hells Canyon boasts excellent fishing for small-mouth bass and sturgeon.

The Hells Canyon National Recreation Area, managed by the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest, hugs the borders of northeastern Oregon and western Idaho. This national showcase holds 652,488 acres of beauty and adventure, where you can let your senses run as wild as the landscape.













## **ROAD ACCESS**

Pittsburg Landing is the only access by road into Hells Canyon from North Central Idaho. Just south of White Bird, take Deer Creek Road where it leaves Hwy 95 at mile marker 222. After crossing the Salmon River, turn left and stay on the main road, approximately 17 miles to Pittsburg Landing. This is a well-maintained, single-lane gravel road with turnouts that crosses the divide between the Salmon and Snake Rivers. There are steep grades on both sides of this divide, so visitors pulling travel trailers or driving RVs should use extreme caution.

Catch a glimpse of petroglyphs and a few pictographs at Buffalo Eddy. This rock art contains hundreds of distinct images associated with early Nez Perce people dating back as early as 4,500 years ago. *20 miles south of Asotin on Snake River Road.* 

## KIRKWOOD RANCH, a small visitor

center with displays of Hells Canyon artifacts and photographs reflecting the history of the area both before and after the coming of western Europeans. Access by a Hells Canyon jet boat tour or drive to Pittsburgh Landing from White Bird and take the foot trail for a 5-mile hike.

## **GARDEN CREEK RANCH** The

Idaho Garden Creek Preserve, once a working cattle ranch and now owned by the Idaho Nature Preserve, is now a facility welcoming its visitors to explore and enjoy this section of the Gorge. Stroll through the orchard, look for deer and turkeys, and enjoy refreshments.

## CACHE CREEK RANCH is an

administrative site located at the northern-most portal on the Snake River within the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area. Historically part of the Dobbin and Huffman Sheep Co. that flourished until the 1930s, it now serves as a shaded oasis for river travelers in the scenic portion of the Snake River. Visitor information and exhibits are available inside the house interpreting unique aspects of the canyon's natural and cultural history. The expansive shady lawns and fruit orchard at Cache Creek attract both wildlife and people during the summer months with public restrooms open yearround.


**PERMITS** are required year-round for all non-commercial floaters and power boaters on the Snake River within the HCNRA. Take time to read the regulations printed on the back of the permit before embarking on your trip. ## RAFT, KAYAK, FLOAT OR JET BOAT THROUGH OUR WILD AND SCENIC RIVER SYSTEM

The first commercial river rafting trips in the United States were launched in Idaho. The outfitters here have always been leaders and standard-setters for this industry. Outfitters offer rafting trips of all kinds for all ages and abilities. Families love the Main Salmon and the Snake River for their white sand beaches and beautiful scenery. The Clearwater River is perfect for a quiet flat water float late in the summer months. Whitewater seekers raft through the Middle Fork of the Salmon, Lochsa, Selway, or the Snake River through Hells Canyon in early spring.

Outfitters take care of everything on these trips. Outfitters row the rafts or lead guests who paddle their own. Tents and waterproof gear bags are provided. Enjoy home-cooked meals, including salads made from fresh fruits and vegetables, and Dutchoven baked breads and desserts. At the end of the day as the sun sets in the canyon, gather around a campfire with your fellow paddlers and enjoy the view. With the help of a local outfitter, explore the scenic rivers that flow through our region.





## **SNAKE RIVER**

The Snake River, flowing through Hells Canyon, is a good run for dories, inflatable kayaks, rafters, and experienced jet boat guides. The river in the lower half of the canyon, below the Pittsburgh Landing rafting take-out, flattens out considerably. Strong upstream breezes are common on summer afternoons and can make rowing a slow, strenuous process. The lower part of the canyon is also a popular weekend playground for jet boaters.

## **CLEARWATER RIVER**

Take a day float from Kooskia to Orofino or from Orofino to the confluence of the Snake River. Wildlife viewing is good and the river is easy to access along Hwy 12. The Lochsa and the Selway come together at Lowell to form the Middle Fork of the Clearwater along Hwy 12. The float begins in lush cedar forests but gradually drier vegetation becomes more pronounced towards the end. While in the area, we recommend driving up the Selway for a look at the falls. In the fall, this is premium steelhead country.

## **GRANDE RONDE RIVER**

Visitors are able to enjoy an unusually long float season for a free-flowing river, from ice breakup in the spring to freeze up in the fall. The Grande Ronde River is a nationally renowned sport fishery, one of the top three in the region. Primitive campsites along the river are on a first-come, first-served basis.

## **SALMON RIVER**

The "River of No Return" is an ideal family rafting destination with mainly class III rapids and lodge-to-lodge stays. Most of the canyon is densely forested with ponderosa pine, Douglas fir and some grand fir. There is good hiking up side creeks, fishing, hot springs, white sand beaches, camping, and historical stops. The Middle Fork of the Salmon flows through the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness, the largest forest wilderness in the lower 48 states.

## A CULTURE RICH IN HISTORY, ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT

According to tribal legend Nimiipuu, "the people," were created in north central Idaho at the dawn of time. There is evidence dating back more than 11,000 years of Nez Perce inhabiting the regions surrounding the Clearwater and Snake River valleys.

Appointed by President Thomas Jefferson, Captains Meriwether Lewis and William Clark were charged with finding the Northwest Passage to the Pacific Coast. The Lewis-Clark Expedition was one of the most significant exploration events in the history of the United States. The explorers camped overnight on an island near the confluence of the Snake and Clearwater rivers located near what is now the sister cities of Lewiston, Idaho and Clarkston, Washington.

The Nez Perce people are credited with saving the lives of the Corps of Discovery explorers who entered their camp near starvation. Without the food and shelter provided by the Nimiipuu villagers, the Lewis and Clark expedition may have had a tragic ending.

Year round, one can indulge in many unique and specialized events in our region. Museums provide insight into how this area was originally home to the Nez Perce Tribe long before the miners and explorers came. From the Native American and Asian cultures, to the Lewis and Clark Expedition, history is vividly displayed. **IDAHO HISTORY TOURS** will take you exploring beneath the sidewalks to feel the presence of the "spirits" that traveled under the sidewalks and worked in the unmentionable side of society in the 1930s.
