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


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

As North America's deepest river gorge, it beckons adventure seekers and nature enthusiasts alike to embark on an exploration that transcends the ordinary. Enter the stage: guided jet boat tours, unlocking the secrets of this breathtaking canyon and offering an immersive experience like no other.

SCENIC JET BOAT TOURS

Step aboard a jet boat for a truly unforgettable Hells Canyon experience. Expert guides navigate custom vessels through local waterways, allowing tours to reach stunning remote spots. The guides share stories of the region's history — like the native Nimiipuu people and their influence- showcasing petroglyphs along the routes and highlighting the old mining settlements. You'll find jet boat tours scheduled for departures from Hells Gate Marina most summer days, and some guides are even moored inside Hells Gate State Park. 2 WHITE WATER RAFTING

Experience the thrill of navigating North America's deepest river gorge. This area is a truly unique treasure for water-based adventure, and our white water rafting is no exception! White water rafting runs from May to October down the Snake River to Lewis Clark Valley, and local groups will guide you 38 miles through the deepest part of Hells Canyon. Families and groups can plan five-day 50-to-70-mile rafting trips down the most scenic and thrilling rapids in the Pacific Northwest.





Discover the rich history of pioneer life at Cache Creek Ranch, a serene historical site hidden amidst the rugged wilderness. This preserved homestead offers a glimpse into the lives of settlers who braved the challenges of Hells Canyon. Walk through restored buildings and let the quiet beauty of the ranch connect you to a simpler, yet demanding era.

KIRKWOOD RANCH VISITOR

CENTER Learn about the delicate interplay between humanity and nature at the Kirkwood Ranch Visitor Center. With interactive exhibits, photographs, and artifacts, this center brings the past to life. From tales of early ranchers to insights into the region's diverse ecosystems, it's a must-visit for anyone wanting to deepen their understanding of the canyon.







Spend the night under a canopy of stars at one of Hells Canyon's riverside beach campsites. These tranquil spots allow you to disconnect from daily life and reconnect with nature. Gather around a campfire under the dark skies to swap stories, listen to the soothing sounds of the river, and wake to the sun illuminating the canyon walls.

BUFFALO EDDY PETROGLYPHS
Step into history at Buffalo Eddy, where ancient petroglyphs carved into stone tell the stories of indigenous peoples who once thrived along the Snake River. These mystical markings are a reminder of the cultural richness that defines Hells Canyon, offering visitors a sacred glimpse into humanity's enduring connection with the land.

7 WILDLIFE WATCHING

Nature lovers will revel in the abundance of wildlife that calls Hells Canyon home. Watch bighorn sheep scale steep cliffs with remarkable agility, spot deer grazing by the water, or catch a bear ambling along the riverbank. 10 FISHING EXCURSIONS

Ready to reel in your greatest catch? Good news — this is an angler's paradise! Partnering with businesses like **Steel Dreams Guide Service** is an excellent place to start when looking to cast in these renowned waters. They launch fishing charters for salmon, sturgeon, steelhead, and smallmouth bass along the Snake and Columbia Rivers and even provide the rods, reels, bait, and tackle for you! At **Reel Time Fishing**, you can work with six guides with over a century of combined guiding experience to help you hook a Snake River walleye or book them for a fly fishing guided tour.

A foolproof family vacation doesn't start with packing. It starts with picking the ideal destination for your needs. Here, where the southeastern corner of the Evergreen State meets the southwestern corner of the Gem State, a great time is always just around the corner.

WAKE UP IN THE WILD

Sure, you can crash at a cute AirBnB in Clarkston or a brand-name hotel in Lewiston. But if you want your morning alarm to be bird song, book a site or cabin at **Chief Timothy Park** (13766 US 12, Clarkston, WA; sunrisereservations. com; 509.758.9580). It's the kind of family-friendly full-service campground where the hosts hand out popsicles on the Fourth of July, cornhole tournaments are a common occurrence, and if you stay in October (before they close for the season), there's trick-or-treating.

You can also camp downstream at **Hells Gate State Park** (5100 Hells Gate Rd., Lewiston, ID; 208.799.5015; parksandrecreation.idaho.gov/parks/

hells-gate). Once the location of a Nez Perce village, today it's home to 80 campsites, three of which are ADA-accessible. If you prefer creature comforts like a roof over your head, book one of the eight cozy cabins. In addition to an amphitheater that hosts live music and events, the campground also offers warm showers, picnic areas, life jacket loaners, and a marina.

Pro tip: Buy it where you burn it! If you bring in firewood from another area, there's a chance it could spread dangerous invasive species. Fortunately, most area campgrounds sell their own.

GET TO KNOW THE NIMIPUU

To pay a visit to the **Nez Perce National Historical Park** (Spalding, ID, 10 miles east of Lewiston; 208.843.7001; nps.gov/nepe) is to pay homage to the Nimiipuu, who French fur traders named the Nez Perce. They lived in the Lewis Clark Valley hundreds of years before Lewis & Clark were even born. Today, the park

consists of 38 sites in four states with the home base at the visitor center in Lapwai. Here, you can watch a fascinating film about these nomadic people who gave us the Appaloosa horse, admire their art and artifacts in the museum, and browse for souvenirs in the gift shop. During the summer, park programming includes guided tours and tipi pitching demonstrations. Year-round, the Junior Ranger packet will keep kids occupied for hours as they learn Nez Perce words, solve rock art mysteries and tackle two scavenger hunts.

Time to stretch your legs? The center also has four interpretive trails along the Clearwater River, all one mile or shorter. They meander through homestead ruins, tribal cemeteries, and a former Nez Pearce village. Pack a lunch and enjoy it in the picnic area that was once the site of a 19th-century missionary settlement.

Pro tip: If you visit in the spring or fall, head to the Lapwai Creek Trail to catch one of nature's coolest phenomena: salmon spawning.







GO WITH THE FLOW

Most people associate the Snake River with rafting. After all, this 1,078-mile-long river named for its meandering ways is the perfect place to paddle. But in addition to offering world-class whitewater, the Snake River also boasts white sand beaches. Even the rockier beaches can be a blast for families looking to cool off in the calm, clear currents. Traveling with your favorite fourlegged friends? Post up at Chief Timothy Park; where dogs have their own dedicated swimming beach. The park, which also has a campground, playground, and picnic pavilions for rent, sits on a 282-acre island at the entrance to Hells Canyon National Recreation Area. Twelve miles downstream in Hells Gate State Park you'll find Hidden Beach, another beautiful boat-free beach.

But that's not to say there's no boating here. In fact, one of the best ways to see Lewis Clark Valley is by jet boat. Choose from a half or full-day excursion, or charter your own boat and drop a line. Hells Canyon is home to North America's largest freshwater fish, so don't be surprised if you reel in a six-foot-long great white sturgeon. If fly fishing is more your speed, you're also in luck. There's no shortage of rainbow trout and smallmouth bass in these parts. Looking for less fishy activities? Kayakers, SUPers, canoers, rafters, and windsurfers are all welcome, too, and rentals are available!

Pro tip: If you catch a sturgeon, you'll have to release it. But photos? They're a keeper.

WAVE WONDERS: SPLASHING INTO ADVENTURE

Children are in for a wild and watery treat at the **Asotin County Aquatic Center** (1603 Dustan Loop, Clarkston, WA; 509.758.0110; theaquaticcenter. org) water park! Boasting thrilling slides, a lazy river, and a joyous adventure pool, it's the ultimate playground for water-loving kids.

The indoor natatorium caters to both fun and fitness, with a lap pool, therapy pool, hot tub, water aerobics, and lessons tailored for young swimmers. While the little ones splash and play, the fitness room offers a haven for parents with cardio machines and weights.

Pro tip: Pack a picnic and bring it with you! Guests are welcome to bring snacks and non-alcoholic beverages to make your day enjoyable and budget friendly.

ROLL INTO EXCITEMENT


Gear up for an epic day of rad moves and skateboarding thrills at Mtn. Dew Skate Park (Kiwanis Park; 1114 Snake River Ave, Lewiston, ID; cityoflewiston. org/parksandrec)! This kid-friendly paradise boasts a whopping 12,000 square feet of skateboarding haven, complete with three pools catering to riders of all levels. Access the park with ease via the Clearwater Snake National Recreational Trail, or if you're rolling in style, just park and ride straight into the action.

Looking for a little indoor excitement? Head over to Lancer Lanes (1250 Bridge Street, Clarkston, WA; 509.758.6731; lancerlanesandcasino. com) or Orchard Lanes (244 Thain Road, Lewiston, ID; 208.743.7822; www.orchardlanesbowling.com), both well-known for their vibrant atmospheres, open their doors to families looking for a striking good time. With spacious lanes, lightweight bowling balls, and the option for bumpers, even the youngest bowlers can experience the thrill of sending pins flying. Beyond the action on the lanes, both alleys offer dining and arcade games.

Pro tip: Signing up for the "Kids Bowl Free" (www.kidsbowlfree.com) summer program is a breeze – a simple online registration, and your family is set to enjoy hours of bowling fun.

SCAN TO EXPLORE MORE FAMILY FUN





Nestled within the embrace of the Inland Northwest lies a golfer's paradise with a unique moniker – the "Banana Belt" of the Lewis Clark Valley. As winter blankets the surrounding regions with snow and frost, this mild climate haven ensures that golf enthusiasts can pursue their passion year-round. The valley proudly boasts four 18-hole courses, offering not just a golfing experience but a rendezvous with nature's beauty and challenging landscapes.

Leading the charge is the illustrious Red Wolf Golf Club (1676 Elm St., Clarkston, WA; redwolfgolfclub. com; 509.758.2546), a riverside gem where the fairways unfold against breathtaking river and valley views. The course, stretching between 5,400 to 6,700 yards, unfolds as a masterpiece of classic tree-lined fairways, complemented by the presence of four shimmering ponds on 8 holes and a strategic array of bunkers. HEAVEN AND HISTORY AWAIT IN HELLS CANYON

"The U.S. Postal Service will deliver mail to anywhere in the United States with a mailing address," says Jill Koch, part owner and operator of Beamers Hells Canyon Tours. Jill and her husband Jim hold the mail delivery contract for what may be one of the most remote mail routes in the lower 48.

Once a week via jet boat, they deliver mail to the dozen or so ranches and year-round residents that live within the deepest gorge in North America. Jim and Jill have been doing this for the last 25 years; 2019 marks the 100-year anniversary of mail service within Hells Canyon. Nowadays, the internet in the canyon is common and residents are able to place orders and communicate with the outside world in ways that previous generations could have never thought possible.

The winter morning broke clear at a crisp 23 degrees as I climbed aboard the mail boat, a blaze-orange, 25' vessel, with the

words US MAIL displayed on the side. Jim took his place in the driver's seat as the boat shook to life. Jill, in charge of hand delivering the mail, sits behind him. Their neighbor, Gene, clambered aboard, the final crew member. We shoved off into the morning light, steam rising off the warmer-than-air Snake River. "43 degrees today," Jim states over the roar of the engine, referring to the water temperature.



winch the boat up the rapids. On that fateful day, the Imnaha made it up and through the rapids, but as a crew member was throwing the lining cable back, the cable became entangled around the ships stern-wheel. The ship was sent back downriver. The bow collided with the Idaho side and stern hit the Oregon side. The boat was then crushed by the weight of water being pushed through the rapids. All of the passengers were rescued except for one horse that wasn't able to get untied in time." Today, our modern jet boat makes quick work of the rapids as we continue our way upstream.






A pair of Common Mergansers lift off the water as we start our 120-mile round trip upriver through the three states of Washington, Oregon, and Idaho. Most of the canyons residents pursue a living from the ranching of cattle and sheep, although, around the turn of the 20th century, there was a brief moment in time where mining was popular. We make our way upriver, stopping at a few properties along the way, until we get to Mountain Sheep rapids, where a narrow column of water is making its way through the canyon. Jim tells the story of the stern-wheel steamboat, the Imnaha, meeting her fate in these rapids November of 1903 on her way upriver to the mining settlement of Eureka. "Back then, the steamboat had to 'line' the rapids. The crew would use a cable secured to the rock to

Along the way we spot Bald Eagles perched in cottonwoods, Bighorn Sheep tiptoeing across basalt cliffs, and Blue Herons fishing the banks of the river. Large herds of elk dozing in the sunshine are visible high above. Stopping at the Flying H Ranch, The Ranch manager greeted us at the river's edge well below the high-water mark, and therefore, the mailbox as well. "Just moved down to the low house," the manager states after living at the higher elevations all summer and fall. Dan runs a herd of 600 cow-calf pairs on roughly 40,000 acres in the canyon, carrying on a tradition that has gone on for over 100 years in this wild country.

Our final mail stop along the route is marked by Kirkwood Bar where caretakers are watching over the historic Kirkwood Ranch for the





winter. The Kirkwood family began ranching here in the 1880s. Now it has been passed down through many hands including former Idaho Governor Len Jordan who was a sheep rancher here during the great depression. After delivery to Kirkwood, we begin the 3-hour ride back down river. As the drone of the engine echoes through the canyon, I can't help but think that it would take several lifetimes to fully absorb this vast place and its' history.

Jim and Jill Koch are licensed outfitters and guides. They open their mail boat to the public every week, year-round. Every Wednesday, for a small fee, you can hop aboard the mail boat and see the beauty of the canyon yourself.


ART, HISTORY AND ENTERTAINMENT IN THE LEWIS CLARK VALLEY

Today, the Nez Perce National Historical Park Visitor Center showcases clothing, daily objects, and artifacts reflecting traditional Nez Perce ways of life, offering a glimpse into their rich cultural heritage.

Nestled within **Nez Perce National Historical Park** (Spalding, ID, 10 miles east of Lewiston; 208.843.7009; nps.gov/nepe), the Visitor Center stands as a gateway to a rich tapestry of Nez Perce heritage. Step inside, and you'll find a captivating collection of clothing and everyday objects that offer a glimpse into the traditional ways of Nez Perce life. Among the treasures is a ribbon, a tangible link to history, bestowed upon a tribal member by the Lewis and Clark Expedition. Surrounding the Center, a harmonious blend of nature and history awaits, with a tranquil picnic area, a vibrant arboretum, and the evocative Spalding townsite—all just a short stroll away.





For a more immersive experience into the Nimiipuu way of life, **Nez Perce Tourism** (800 Main Street Suite 4; Lewiston, ID; 208.790.8873; nezpercetourism.com) welcomes visitors with interactive storytelling, songs, drumming, and dance. From river beds to mountain tops, their land and water journeys offer a profound connection to the cultural heritage of Nimiipuu Country.

A WALK THROUGH HISTORY: MUSEUMS AND TOURS

The Lewis-Clark Valley is a haven for history enthusiasts, with museums and tours that vividly bring the past to life. Idaho History Tours (208.790.1257; idahohistorytours.com) take you beneath the sidewalks, revealing the hidden stories of the 1930s. The Nez Perce County Historical Society Museum & Idaho's First Territorial Capitol (3rd and Capital St., Lewiston, ID; 208.743.2535; nezpercecountymuseum.com) preserves 150 years of the county's history, housed in a historical campus with a beautiful historic house and replica capitol building.



Across the river in Asotin, the **Asotin County Museum** (215 Filmore Street, Asotin, WA; 509.243.4659; asotincountymuseum.org) offers an authentic glimpse into frontier life as settlers experienced it. Housed in a cement block building originally built as a funeral parlor in 1920, this museum features fascinating hands-on exhibits that invite visitors to engage with the past. The museum became home to the Asotin County Historical Society in 1972 and continues to preserve local history.

At the Lewis-Clark Discovery Center at Hells Gate State Park (5100 Hells Gate State Rd.; Lewiston, ID; 208.799.5015; parksandrecreation.idaho.gov/parks/hells-gate), interpretive displays, including an Indian tepee and dugout canoe, provide insights into the region's rich cultural history. Enjoy a 30-minute video, "Lewis & Clark: From the Mountains to the Sea," and explore the nearby trails for horseback riding, mountain biking, hiking, and scenic views of the Snake River.

The Jack O'Connor Hunting Heritage & Education Center (5600 Hells Gate Rd.; Lewiston, ID; 208.743.5043; jack-oconnor.org) stands as a testament to the passion and legacy of renowned sportsman Jack O'Connor. This center serves as the permanent residence for the O'Connor wildlife collection, a treasure trove of stunning wildlife trophies acquired from various corners of the globe.






A PALETTE OF CULTURE: PUBLIC

flora. A bronze sculpture of Sacajawea graces the entrance of Sacajawea Hall, adding a touch of historical significance to the campus landscape.


